

Summer Stephan,

This is another direct request for your office to look at what is happening to Malaika and Xayah Robinson and to the family still fighting for them. These are two human beings taken from a loving family under the guise of child protection, followed by false reporting, retaliation, coercion, case fixing, family separation, catastrophic psychological and emotional harm, and a grudge-driven abuse of government power against an entire family.

The retaliation is not hidden. Their own records repeatedly document what they were focused on: the website, the blog, public exposure, Board of Supervisors speeches, and protected speech. We put what was happening into the light, and instead of correcting the conduct, the system became more aggressive. Visits disappeared, accusations multiplied, family members were pushed out, and restraining orders followed. The proof is in their reports. The proof is in the actions that followed.

This became a good-old-boy, good-old-girl system protecting itself. Social workers, attorneys, supervisors, private citizens, restraining orders, and courtroom pressure all came down on the same family. Government authority became retaliation, personal grudges became official action, and people with the power to stop it instead protected the machinery producing it.

The courtroom became part of that same machinery. Judge after judge has been handed the same agency narrative: no bond, not safe, the family is the problem. Those claims continue despite recordings, visitation history, the children's severe distress, contradictory reports, and expert testimony showing otherwise. The agency asks, the lawyers reinforce it, and the court keeps giving them what they want. At some point, this no longer resembles independent judicial review.

What should alarm your office is the sheer scale of government involvement. Social workers, supervisors, County Counsel, the guardian ad litem's office, appointed attorneys, investigators, multiple judges, and private citizens have all become part of a case that has generated thousands of pages, repeated accusations, restraining orders, hearings, and more than two years of family separation. At some point, the scale itself demands investigation.

Your office also needs to examine how Evelyn Lopez was pressured back to San Diego. Ashlee Purnell pursued her while Norma Olivares, a private citizen, located her after intercepting federal mail, contacted her, and persuaded her to return and turn herself in. Evelyn did exactly that. Norma then ended up with the children while Child Welfare continued separating Malaika and Xayah from their own family. The coordination between government actors and private citizens demands investigation.

Behind closed doors, the pressure on Evelyn was relentless. David Miller used her children as leverage, blocked a doorway after emotionally devastating visits, pressured and intimidated her, interfered during therapy, and repeatedly dictated what she had to do to get her children back. We have a social worker recorded telling her, in substance, move out of the grandfather's home and I will return your children; stay there and I will not.

San Diego County had already RFA approved me and that same home for placement of Malaika and Xayah.

Meanwhile, Malaika and Xayah continue showing the damage. Our family documented hospitalizations, screaming, meltdowns, head-banging, abuse concerns, and children begging not to leave their mother. A neurotherapist conducting a bond study personally witnessed Malaika suffer a meltdown lasting more than 25 minutes because she did not want to leave her mother and return to the caregiver. She warned of catastrophic psychological and emotional harm from severing these family bonds. Parental rights were terminated anyway. The harm continues.

This is not hearsay. We have recordings, videos, sworn statements, medical records, agency reports, court records, and witnesses. I am asking your office to independently investigate the retaliation, false reporting, coercion, case fixing, abuse of authority, handling of abuse concerns, and coordinated conduct that continues keeping Malaika and Xayah separated from their family.

Follow the reports. Follow the recordings. Follow the actions. Hold accountable anyone who broke the law. Malaika and Xayah have a mother, father, grandparents, siblings, cousins, and extended family that continue fighting for them. Malaika and Xayah need to come home.
