

Donald Trump Jr.,

I am following up on the package I previously sent concerning my granddaughters, Malaika and Xayah Robinson, and their mother, Evelyn Lopez. I am reaching out again because I am pleading for help getting two little girls back to the family that continues fighting for them.

What has happened to this family in San Diego should disturb anyone who believes Americans have the right to question government, expose misconduct, defend their children, and speak publicly without being punished for it.

Malaika and Xayah have a mother, father, grandparents, relatives, and an entire family that loves them. Their mother completed her court-ordered case plan. Our family was approved and willing to care for them. Yet instead of bringing these children home, the system kept moving toward permanent separation while the family was treated more aggressively every time we spoke out.

At times, the way this family has been treated feels less like America and more like something you would expect from an authoritarian government: speak out and you are punished; expose misconduct and restrictions increase; challenge the official story and you are treated as the problem.

We created websites, appeared on podcasts, distributed flyers, spoke at public meetings, contacted elected officials, journalists, advocates, and others, and refused to remain silent about what we were seeing. Then came greater restrictions, attacks on kinship placement, new accusations, restraining orders, and deeper separation from the children.

The retaliation spread beyond the immediate family. Advocates who stood with us were targeted and pushed away. Investigative journalists attempting to look into the case encountered resistance and obstruction. People who tried to bring independent scrutiny into what was happening became problems for the system instead of resources for finding the truth.

Meanwhile, Malaika and Xayah continue suffering.

These children have screamed for their family, cried, pulled their hair, emotionally collapsed, and shown severe distress connected to separation and returning to their placement. Malaika suffered an approximately 25-minute emotional breakdown in front of her neurotherapist because she did not want to return. Expert testimony addressed the strong family bonds and the catastrophic psychological and emotional harm associated with continuing this separation.

Their mother, Evelyn Lopez, has endured extraordinary emotional and physical shock from what has been done to her and her children. She completed what the court required of her and continued fighting for her daughters, yet her parental rights were still terminated.

This month marks one full year since I have seen my granddaughters. Evelyn has not seen her children since June 4.

Think about that. A mother who completed her case plan is kept from her children. A grandfather loses an entire year with his granddaughters. The children continue showing trauma, and the system calls this protection.

A private nonrelative caregiver, Norma Olivares, also became deeply intertwined with this case while the blood family was pushed farther away. Serious accusations were made against members of our family while the County continued protecting the placement and treating relatives as the danger.

A lot of people need to understand that what is happening in San Diego no longer looks like child protection. Families are being terrorized, children are being separated from people who love them, and adoption is pushed while parents and relatives are still fighting to keep their families together. What our family has experienced looks like a child-trafficking network operating under the cover of child welfare, and it deserves an independent outside investigation.

Malaika and Xayah are not abandoned children. They are not children without family. They have a mother, father, grandparents, relatives, and newborn twin siblings they have never even been allowed to meet. Shortly after Evelyn left the hospital, County workers literally went out at twilight trying to locate those newborn twins. They were caught on video, confronted, and ultimately left without taking the twins into the system.

Their great-grandmother, my mother, died while still fighting to see Malaika and Xayah returned to their family. She should have been celebrating her 89th birthday this month. Instead, the girls will never see her again. That time can never be returned to them.

Our family has recordings, videos, communications, court history, reports, expert testimony, medical records, and timelines. We have been preserving evidence because this story is far larger than what can be explained in one letter.

It is also no longer confined to San Diego County. I have written from the White House on down—to federal agencies, senators, members of Congress, attorneys, journalists, advocates, social workers, child-development professionals, and others capable of bringing independent scrutiny to this case. Our family appears in the two-hour

documentary Never in America beginning at approximately the 1:41:00 mark, and millions of people have seen that documentary on X alone.

Donald Jr., I am not asking you to accept every statement in this letter without examining the evidence. I am asking you to help us get that evidence in front of people who are independent of San Diego County and who have the influence, authority, or platform to make someone finally look at what has been done to this family.

Government officials cannot take children because their authority was challenged or their conduct was exposed. They cannot use children as leverage against parents, grandparents, advocates, or anyone else who refuses to remain silent. No one in this family committed a crime that justifies destroying these relationships.

Two young girls are growing up while years with their family disappear.

Please help us get independent eyes on this case. Please help us get the recordings, records, testimony, and history before people who can act.

Most importantly, please help Malaika and Xayah come home to the family that loves them.

Thank you for reading this and for any help you can give our family.
